## General Interest Websites:

**www.ancestry.com** (Includes vital records, census records, immigration records, military records, newspaper articles, and more. **Access in the library is free**; otherwise, subscription is required. For free in-library access, **you must go through our home page**, [www.claytonpl.org](http://www.claytonpl.org). Click on “Subject Guides” in the menu on the left and then click on “Genealogy.” Finally, select the “Ancestry.com” link.)

**www.cyndislist.com** (Lists over 260,000 online genealogy sites, organized by categories.)

**www.familysearch.org** (Search vital records, census records, Social Security Death Index, etc. Also, try some of the useful resources under the “Learn” tab.)

**www.findagrave.com** (Find a cemetery, a specific grave, or even a tombstone transcription.)

**www.raogk.org** (Random acts of genealogical kindness website. Volunteers across the United States list things they are willing to do, such as taking photos of tombstones, looking up historical records at local courthouses, etc.)
